Prof. Grachev started his career in the 1960s as an engineer, then as a lecturer at the Penza State Polytechnic Institute. In 1990, he was elected a People's Deputy, Deputy Chairman of the Committee for Science and Education at the Supreme Soviet of the Russian Federation. In 1994–1999, Prof. Grachev was the Chief of Staff for the Federation Council Committee on Science, Culture, Education, Health and Ecology. In 1999–2007, Prof. Grachev was elected a Deputy for the State Duma, Chairman of the Committee on Ecology. Since 2009, Prof. Grachev has been Chairman of the Board of the GREENLIGHT Interregional Environmental NGO and President of the V.I. Vernadsky Nongovernmental Ecological Foundation, since 2014 – President of the Russian Environmental Academy.

Prof. Grachev is the author of 243 inventions, 730 published works, 29 monographs, 10 textbooks, and 15 manuals.
